

Ontario's Warm Water Game Fish

LARGEMOUTH BASS



Identification

- · "Football" shaped
- Green color with a dark horizontal stripe extending the length of the body
- · Lower jaw extends past the eye

Habitat

- Warm water in small lakes, shallow bays of larger lakes, and larger slow-moving river systems. Prefer shallow water, but can be found in depths up to 20 feet.
- Near dense vegetation or cover like stumps, lily pads, cattails, and other aquatic plants.

Spawning Patterns

- Late spring to early summer when water temperatures reach 16-18°C.
- Spawning sites are over soft, muddy bottoms with bulrushes, lily pads or reeds.
- Males are very territorial at this time and spawning sites are rarely closer than 30 feet from each other.
- Females can produce over 100,000 eggs! Eggs usually hatch within five days but remain with the male for protection for up to a month.

Diet

Eat a wide variety of food including other fish, crayfish, frogs, and large insects.

Age and Size

- Can live 15 years.
- Usually 10-20 inches long; Ontario Angler Award minimum length is 18 inches.
- Ontario record weight is 10.43 lb.

Fishing Tips

- Exciting, hard fighting fish that will jump out of water for prey.
- Use shallow-running crankbaits or top-water baits (especially during calm water evenings).
- Use plastic worms such as a Senko-style bait, and fish slowly through dense cover.
- A simple option is to use a hook, bobber and worm.
- Keep a net handy for landing fish safely.
